Buzz Young Inspectors (BYI's)

Who are they?

A group of young people who go out and inspect activities, then rate them to see how accessible and fun they are to children and young people with additional needs.

What do they do?

Visit places such as football groups, drama clubs, climbing groups, youth centres and more. The BYI's aim is to make sure voung people with additional needs have fun things to do.

How are places rated?

Using headings such as 'fun' 'staff' 'safe', checking who it is accessible to and the facilities a place has. They use stars to describe what they 'rate' a place overall.

What happens after the BYI's review a place?

The group will share their results with each of the activity groups. They will let them know the things they are good at, and anything they can do better.
